Hope to see you next month at the October 11th Membership Appreciation Event!












If Yes or Maybe, please check how you would consider participating as a Micro-Volunteer. 10 responses


Community Outreach







TRENCH & EXCAVATION: COMPETENT PERSON TRAINING

Please Join Contractor Academy, United Rentals, Construction Education Foundation and Iron Woman for a "Trench & Excavation: Competent Person" training.

According to OSHA 29 CFR 1926 Subpart P, every excavation must have a designated Competent Person to manage the safety aspects of the site. To properly carry out Competent Person responsibilities, this individual must have training in, and be knowledgeable about, soil analysis, the use of protective systems and the requirements of the standard. Additional responsibilities include identifying existing and predictable hazards in the work environment and possessing the authority to take prompt corrective action.

On Aug. 9, 2024, ASSP was honored to welcome Doug Parker, assistant secretary of labor for occupational safety and health, to address the sold-out Safety 2024 Conference in Denver, CO. He also highlighted several of the agency's latest efforts, including:

- National emphasis programs on fall protection and preventing workplace hazards in warehousing, distribution and higher risk retail sectors
- VPP modernization
- Work to address imminent dangers
- Rulemaking activities
- Increased whistleblower protections
- Promoting health and safety management systems to go beyond compliance

OSHA Proposed Rule: Heat Injury and Illness Prevention in Outdoor and Indoor Work Settings.

The standard would apply to all employers conducting outdoor and indoor work in all general industry, construction, maritime, and agriculture sectors where OSHA has jurisdiction, with some exceptions.
