TRENCH & EXCAVATION: COMPETENT PERSON TRAINING

Please Join Contractor Academy, United Rentals, Construction Education Foundation and Iron Woman for a "Trench & Excavation: Competent Person" training.

According to OSHA 29 CFR 1926 Subpart P, every excavation must have a designated Competent Person to manage the safety aspects of the site. To properly carry out Competent Person responsibilities, this individual must have training in, and be knowledgeable about, soil analysis, the use of protective systems and the requirements of the standard. Additional responsibilities include identifying existing and predictable hazards in the work environment and possessing the authority to take prompt corrective action.

Overturning Chevron: An OSH Professional Perspective

Many ASSP members have asked about the anticipated impact of the U.S. Supreme Court decision on Chevron. A recent article in Professional Safety journal shares an EHS practitioner's perspective.

On June 28, 2024 the U.S. Supreme Court issued its decision to overturn the 1984 landmark case of Chevron v. Natural Resources Defense Council. The Chevron decision required judges to give deference to federal agencies to interpret ambiguous federal laws including the OSH Act of 1970.

Department of Labor Completes Restructuring of OSHA Regional Offices

On October 1, OSHA completed changes to restructure its regional operations; among the changes includes:

- Creation of a new region based in Birmingham to serve Alabama, Arkansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Tennessee and the Florida Panhandle,
- Combined operations that had been designated as Regions 9 and 10 to create a new San Francisco Region,
- OSHA will now also use geographic designations to identify and rename its regions rather than numerals (Region 8 will be known as the "Denver Region").
