

# Worker Deaths Decline in 2024

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) announced a decline in worker death investigations in fiscal year (FY) 2024, suggesting OSHA's strong enforcement and ongoing collaboration with both labor and management is saving lives.

Excluding Covid-related deaths, federal OSHA investigated 826 worker deaths, an 11 percent reduction from 928 in the previous year. This is the lowest number of fatalities the agency has been mandated to investigate since FY 2017.
