Senate Panel Backs OSHA, MSHA and NIOSH Funding: What It Means for Safety

On September 3, 2025, The Senate Appropriations Committee has advanced legislation that would maintain — and in some cases slightly increase — funding for key federal safety agencies in fiscal year 2026. This is an important milestone for the occupational environmental, health and safety (EHS) community and reflects the value of ongoing advocacy by ASSP and our members.

US Department of Labor unveils proposals to put American workers, businesses first in release of semiannual regulatory agenda

On September 4, 2025, the Trump Administration announced its Unified Agenda of Regulatory and Deregulatory Actions, which provides the American people with a transparent look at regulations being considered by the Administration and ensures the public is engaged throughout the process. The department advanced a set of high-priority actions designed to reduce unnecessary burdens on employers and employees.



## **EPA** proposes approval of Wyoming coal residuals permit program

On August 28, 2025, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) proposed to approve Wyoming's coal combustion residuals (CCR) program application. This proposal would allow the state rather than the federal government to manage coal residuals disposal in surface impoundments and landfills.

#### 2025-2026 COVID-19 vaccines

On Sept. 3, 2025, CDPHE Executive Director Jill Hunsaker Ryan issued Public Health Order 25-01: Access to COVID-19 Vaccines, and CDPHE's Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Ned Calonge, issued a standing order that will take effect on Friday, Sept. 5.

The standing order allows appropriately trained health care workers to administer vaccines according to a protocol. This allows Coloradans to receive the vaccine at participating providers and pharmacies without having to first obtain an individual prescription.
